

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS PIRTEK FISHING CHALLENGE**

1. The Pirtek Fishing Challenge ("the Competition") is an open fishing competition.
2. The Competition is conducted by National Fishing Challenge Pty Ltd ("the Organisers").
3. The object of the Competition is the Capture, Measure, Photograph and Release of fish, with the exception of exotic fish species which have been declared noxious or pest fish. Please see Clause 36 for further details.
4. The Competition will take place on Saturday 17 April 2021 and Sunday, 18 April 2021.
5. Registration fees for the Pirtek Fishing Challenge:
  - a. Adult entry AU\$25.00, plus postage and handling per entry.
  - b. Junior entry (16 years of age or under at the start of the calendar year) AU\$25.00, plus postage and handling per entry. Every junior entry will receive one packet of Berkley Powerbait Nemesis 3 inch, valued at \$9.95RRP.
  - c. Family entry AU\$99.00, five (5) family members plus postage and handling per entry.
  - d. Company entry AU\$500.00, sixteen (16) employees from one company plus postage and handling per entry.
6. Registrations for the competition will open at 12.01am (AEDT) Monday 18 January 2021 and close at 11.59pm (AEST) on Friday 16 April 2021 or until the stock of brag mats and caps are sold, whichever occurs first.
7. All paid and registered Competitors are eligible to enter the On The Water Prize Draw.
  - a. Please see the Terms and Conditions of the On The Water Prize Draw for full details.
  - b. The On The Water Prize Draw will open at 12.01am (AEDT) Monday 18 January 2021 and close at 11.59pm (AEST) on Friday 16 April 2021 or until the stock of brag mats and caps are sold, whichever occurs first.
8. All paid and registered corporate entries are eligible to enter the Fight a Fish with Guesty Prize Draw.
  - a. Please see Terms and Conditions of the Fight a Fish with Guesty Prize Draw for full details.
  - b. The Fight a Fish with Guesty Prize Draw will open at 12.01am (AEDT) Monday 18 January 2021 and close at 11.59pm (AEST) on Friday 16 April 2021 or until the stock of brag mats and caps are sold, whichever occurs first.
9. All paid and registered Competitors are eligible to enter the Lowrance Fishing Club Giveaway.

- a. Please see the Terms and Conditions of the Lowrance Fishing Club Giveaway for full details.
- b. The Lowrance Fishing Club Giveaway will open at 12.01am (AEDT) Monday 18 January 2021 and close at 11.59pm (AEST) on Friday 16 April 2021 or until the stock of brag mats and caps are sold, whichever occurs first.

10. Pirtek Fishing Challenge Privacy Policy.
  - a. PIRTEK FLUID SYSTEMS PTY LTD (ACN 71 001 824 166), NATIONAL FISHING CHALLENGE PTY LTD (ABN 45 131 475 986) and associated entities (PIRTEK) PRIVACY POLICY
  - b. PIRTEK is covered by 10 National Privacy Principles (the NPP's) as set out in the Privacy Act 1988 (amended by the Privacy Agreement (Private Sector) Act 2000 – "The Privacy Act".
  - c. To comply with our obligations under the NPP's, we have a Privacy Policy, which sets out how we manage privacy in our organisation.
  - d. PIRTEK may collect and hold personal information for the primary purpose of allowing it to enter into business and marketing related transactions. The collection, use and disclosure of information are in compliance with the Privacy Act however we will not share or sell this information to third parties.
  - e. Further details regarding the collection use and disclose of the information is available in our Collection, Use and Disclosure Statement, which is available on request.

11. Registered anglers will be able to unsubscribe from Pirtek Fishing Challenge e-mail updates and event media releases.
  - a. All registered anglers will receive the following compulsory emails:
    - i. confirmation of registration, angler number and welcome
    - ii. angler number, codeword and species list
    - iii. list of competition and prize draw winners

## **GENERAL RULES**

12. All Competitors must hold a valid fishing license as per State / Territory regulations. Competitors may be asked to produce proof of the license before prizes are awarded.
13. Target species for each Australian State or Territory, Murray Darling Basin category, Mountain Trout category, East Coast category, Top End category and South Australia/Southern Western Australia category will be advised on the website [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au) from Monday 18 January 2021.
14. The Competitor will receive their unique angler number via email on completion of registration and payment.

15. The Competition codeword will be available on the website [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au), the Pirtek Fishing Challenge app and via email on Friday 16 April 2021 after 6.00 pm AEST.
16. If a Competitor does not receive a Pirtek Fishing Challenge 2021 brag mat in time for the Competition they may use an alternative brag mat or a Pirtek Fishing Challenge brag mat from a previous year.
  - a. The alternative brag mat must include clearly visible millimetre and centimetre increments as per the recommendations of the Australian National Measurement Institute
  - b. If using an alternative brag mat the competitor must write the angler number and code word clearly on a piece of white cardboard 100mm x 100mm in size and place on the brag mat for inclusion in the photograph
  - c. Any Competitor found using a brag mat with an incorrect measurement index will be excluded from the Competition.
17. Fishing hours for Competitors will be:
  - a. Saturday 17 April 2021. Commence fishing at the official sunrise time in their State/Territory and cease fishing at the official sunset time in their State/Territory.
    - i. No lines in water prior to the official sunrise time (State/Territory of the Competitor) on Saturday, 17 April 2021 and all lines out of the water at the official sunset time (State/Territory of the Competitor)
  - b. Sunday, 18 April 2021. Commence fishing at the official sunrise time in their State/Territory and cease fishing at the official sunset time in their State/Territory
    - i. No lines in water prior to the official sunrise time (State/Territory of the Competitor) on Sunday, 18 April 2021 and all lines out of the water at the official sunset time (State/Territory of the Competitor)
  - c. Official sunrise and sunset times can be found at [www.timeanddate.com](http://www.timeanddate.com). For example, the official sunrise time for Sydney on Saturday 17 April 2021 is 6.19am.
18. Any fish caught outside of Competition hours will be excluded from the competition.
19. Junior Competitors must be 16 years of age or under at the start of the calendar year.
20. Both junior and senior Competitors may only enter fish caught by themselves.
21. All fish must comply with State Fisheries minimum lengths and bag limits.
22. The Organisers strongly recommends for all anglers to avoid targeting spawning or pre-spawning aggregations of fish stocks, and to avoid interactions with threatened fish and other threatened aquatic species.
23. Anglers may fish a maximum of 2 lines in the water at any one time.
24. Netting with a hand-held landing net or a set of lip grips is the **only assistance** permissible to a competitor (junior or senior) in the capture of a fish. When using lip grips always support the belly of the fish.

25. The Organisers strongly recommend the use of knotless (eg Environet style) nets for landing of fish.
26. If a noxious/pest fish is chosen as a target species it can be photographed on the brag mat then dispatched as per State Fisheries guidelines and regulations. For example, NSW State Fisheries regulations recommend fish be dispatched by a sharp blow to the head or placed in an ice slurry. The fish should be disposed of in an appropriate waste bin.
27. Boats, canoes and kayaks must comply with Waterways safety requirements. Please ensure all boats, canoes, kayaks and trailers are free of noxious weeds, plants and their seeds before entering the waterway.
28. The Organizers strongly recommend the use of Australian bait products only and discourage the use of imported baits such as frozen prawns.
29. Any noxious/pest fish species caught, i.e. carp or tilapia, should be disposed of according to State Fisheries regulations.
30. All Competitors are strictly advised to remove all rubbish from campsites and waterways and place them in the correct disposal areas/bins.
31. Where possible the Organisers recommend the use of kayaks, canoes or electric motors to minimize the carbon footprint of the competition.
32. The Competition is not open to commercial fishing vessels (recreation style charter vessels are permitted).
33. All fish must be caught on rod and reel or hand line with the number of hooks/lures as per State Fisheries regulations. Electronic reels are not permitted for use except for persons with a disability.
34. Commercial fishing methods and techniques (nets, trawl, and longline) are not permitted.
35. Fishing inside marine parks and reserves may be prohibited in your State. Please check with your local authority to confirm areas permitted for recreational fishing. Any fish taken from these restricted areas will be ineligible for entry into the Competition.
36. No farmed or commercially grown fish are permitted in the Competition.
37. Hatchery fish and home aquarium fish are excluded from the Competition.
38. Fish stocked in private dams are excluded from the Competition, only impoundments open to the public are permitted.
39. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to past or present disruptive or abusive competitors. There will be no dialogue or negotiation and the Organisers decision will be final.
40. Participants, Competitors and Observers:
  - a. acknowledge that fishing and boating are activities which contain elements of risk and danger;
  - b. acknowledge that the decision to participate in the Competition and the decision to go to sea is theirs alone;

- c. accept full responsibility for their own safety and the risks and consequences of participating in the event;
- d. hold National Fishing Challenge Pty Ltd, Pirtek Fluid Systems Pty Ltd, its associated companies and franchisees blameless;
- e. release and discharge National Fishing Challenge Pty Ltd, Pirtek Fluid Systems Pty Ltd, its associated companies and franchisees from any liability; and
- f. indemnify National Fishing Challenge Pty Ltd, Pirtek Fluid Systems Pty Ltd, its associated companies and franchisees for any claims, actions, suits and court proceedings brought against it or any of them arising from the conduct of the event.

## MEASUREMENT AND PHOTOGRAPHY

- 41. All fish measured and photographed on the Pirtek Fishing Challenge\_brag mat must be positioned with the nose of the fish at the "0" marker. Any fish with the tail to the "0" marker will be excluded from the competition.
  - a. The dorsal fin must point towards the top of the brag mat. Any fish photographs submitted with the fish upside down (i.e. the dorsal fin to the bottom of the brag mat) will be excluded.
  - b. Flat fish are to be positioned belly down on the brag mat.
- 42. Once the photograph has been taken the fish must be released as quickly as possible, carefully back into the water.
  - a. Any evidence of fish being killed after the photograph has been taken will see that fish ineligible for the competition. Any fish deemed to be dead or unable to be released by the Organisers will be ineligible. Guidelines for best practice release methods can be found at [http://www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/\\_data/assets/pdf\\_file/0009/478053/nsw-recreational-fishing-catch-and-release-handbook.pdf](http://www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/_data/assets/pdf_file/0009/478053/nsw-recreational-fishing-catch-and-release-handbook.pdf)
  - b. Noxious/pest species deemed by State Fisheries to be a pest and recommended not to be returned to the waterway should be dispatched as per State Fisheries guidelines and regulations.
- 43. Photographs must be of a live, non-mutilated fish.
- 44. Photographs of competition fish must be taken in daylight hours.
- 45. Photographs of competition fish taken in the dark will be excluded from the competition.
- 46. Photographs of competition fish taken with a flash will be excluded from the competition.
- 47. Any digital manipulation of photographs is prohibited and will result in instant disqualification of the competing angler.
- 48. It is the responsibility of the competing angler to ensure photographs are uploaded to the website correctly.
- 49. Photographs may **ONLY** be uploaded to the Pirtek Fishing Challenge app or website. Any photographs received from competing anglers via email or Facebook

will not be eligible for the target species photograph and release section of the Competition.

50. Competitors may upload one (1) photograph per target species in their chosen category or categories. For example:
  - a. A Competitor fishing in Queensland may decide to target three QLD State species in the Competition. They would be eligible to upload **THREE** photographs for judging, **ONE** of each target species.
  - b. A Competitor fishing in New South Wales may decide to fish for Mountain Trout on the first day of the Competition and move to the NSW Coast to fish for whiting on the second day of the Competition. They would be eligible to upload **TWO** photographs for judging, **ONE** of each target species.
51. Only one (1) photograph will be accepted for each target species per Competitor.
52. In the event more than one (1) photograph of a target species is uploaded by a Competitor the first photograph received will be judged by the panel.
53. Photographs may be uploaded to the Pirtek Fishing Challenge app or [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au) by Competitors from 30 minutes after official sunrise time in their State/Territory on Saturday 17 April 2021 until 0700 hours, Monday 19 April 2021 (State/Territory time).
  - a. Official sunrise times can be found at [www.timeanddate.com](http://www.timeanddate.com).
54. In the event a Competitor does not upload their fish photograph prior to 0700 hours on Monday, 19 April 2021 (State/Territory time) the Competitor will not be eligible for the target species photograph and release section of the Competition.
55. Competitors must complete the photo upload information page correctly and accurately.
  - a. All fish are measured at an overall length to the millimetre. From the nose to the tip of the tail.
  - b. Fish photos uploaded with the incorrect information may not be eligible for judging.
56. Any photographs sent to [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au) can be used for marketing or advertising purposes by the Organisers.

## **CATEGORY INFORMATION**

57. The Murray Darling Basin category:
  - a. The Murray Darling Basin (MDB) encompasses an area from south-western Queensland, western New South Wales, central western Victoria and the Murray catchment in South Australia.
  - b. Fish eligible for the Murray Darling Basin category can be caught in any river or tributary flowing into either the Murray or Darling Rivers. To simplify, any public river, tributary or creek that flows west of the Great Dividing Range and eventually into the Murray or Darling rivers is permitted.
  - c. An extension to the Murray Darling Basin boundaries will apply in Queensland north from Chinchilla to Emerald and west to Longreach.

- d. A detailed map of the Murray Darling Basin boundaries is available on [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- e. Competitors can be from Queensland, New South Wales / ACT, Victoria and South Australia.
- f. Fish entered in this category are entered as Murray Darling Basin or MDB and not State specific.
- g. Public impoundments that are west of the Great Dividing Range and open to fishing for the target species selected are eligible for inclusion.
- h. Private dams and impoundments are strictly excluded from the Competition.
- i. If Murray Cod is chosen as a target species it can only be caught on artificial lures. No bait of any description – live, dead or synthetic – can be used.
- j. If Murray Cod is chosen as a target species no South Australian waterways can be fished for this species. South Australia Fisheries regulations dictate Murray Cod must remain in the water and cannot be photographed on a brag mat. This excludes South Australian Murray Cod from the Competition.
- k. Any Competitor found to be using bait to target Murray Cod will be excluded from the Competition. No exceptions.
- l. It is also highly recommended to wet your brag mat before carefully supporting and placing the Murray Cod on the mat for the photograph, quickly releasing the fish carefully into the water.
- m. There will be four (4) target species in the Murray Darling Basin category
  - i. A \$4000 mystery length cash prize for each target species will be awarded for the senior competition only.
  - ii. Prizes will be awarded for senior first, second, third and junior first, second and third for the four (4) target species. These prizes are for the fish measuring the longest, second longest and third longest in each category.

58. The Mountain Trout category:

- a. The target species for the Mountain Trout (MT) category will be a freshwater fish which inhabits an area inside the Great Dividing Range on the Australian mainland boundary from the southern Queensland border through New South Wales and Victoria finishing at the Grampians, including Ballarat.
- b. This category also includes Tasmania.
- c. A detailed map of the Mountain Trout boundaries is available at [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- d. Fish eligible for the Mountain Trout category can be caught in any public river, tributary or impoundment flowing or existing inside the Mountain Trout boundary as per the map available on [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- e. Competitors can be from Queensland, ACT / New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania.

- f. Fish entered in this category are nominated as Mountain Trout category and not State specific.
- g. Public impoundments contained inside the Mountain Trout boundary map and open to fishing for the target species selected are eligible for inclusion.
- h. Private dams and impoundments are strictly excluded from the Competition.
- i. There will be one (1) target species in the Mountain Trout category
  - i. A \$4000 mystery length cash prize for the target species will be awarded for the senior competition only.
  - ii. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, third and junior first, second and third for the target species. These prizes are for the fish measuring the longest, second longest and third longest in each category.

59. The East Coast category:

- a. The target species for the East Coast (EC) category will be a freshwater fish which inhabits an area in coastal rivers, lakes and estuaries of Eastern Australia from Fraser Island, Queensland, to Wilson Promontory, Victoria.
- b. This fish is also found in many public impoundments within Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria due to artificial stocking programs.
- c. A detailed map of the East Coast boundaries is available on [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- d. Fish eligible for the East Coast category can be caught in any public river, tributary or public impoundment within the area outlined on the map available at [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- e. Competitors can be from Queensland, Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales and Victoria.
- f. Private dams and impoundments are strictly excluded from the Pirtek Fishing Challenge.
- g. Fish entered in this category are nominated as East Coast (EC) and not State specific.
- h. There will be one (1) target species in the East Coast category:
  - i. A \$4000 mystery length cash prize for the target species will be awarded for the senior competition only.
  - ii. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, third and junior first, second and third for the target species. These prizes are for the fish measuring the longest, second longest and third longest in each category.

60. The Top End category:

- a. The target species for the Top End (TE) category encompasses all the Northern Territory including the major offshore islands and Western Australia from the Northern Territory / West Australian corner border, heading west in a straight line to Kalbarri and north.

- b. A detailed map of the Top End boundaries is available at [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- c. Fish eligible for the Top End category can be caught in any river, tributary, estuary or Australian open waters. Fishing is permitted in public impoundments.
- d. Fish entered in this category are nominated as Top End (TE) and not State specific.
- e. Private dams and impoundments are strictly excluded from the Pirtek Fishing Challenge.
- f. There will be two (2) target species in the Top End category:
  - i. A \$4000 mystery length cash prize for each target species will be awarded for the senior competition only.
  - ii. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, third and junior first, second and third for the target species. These prizes are for the fish measuring the longest, second longest and third longest in each category.

61. South Australia and Southern Western Australia:

- a. The target species for the South Australia and South Western Australia (SASWA) category encompasses the southern half of Western Australia from Kalbarri in the north, in a straight line to the Western Australia / Northern Territory corner border and south and all of South Australia. Please see attached map.
- b. A detailed map of the South Australia and Southern Western Australia boundaries is available at [www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au](http://www.pirtekfishingchallenge.com.au)
- c. Fish eligible for the SASWA category can be caught in any river, tributary, estuary or Australian open waters.
- d. Fish entered in this category are nominated as SASWA and not State specific.
- e. Private dams and impoundments are strictly excluded from the Pirtek Fishing Challenge.
- f. There will be two (2) target species in the SASWA category:
  - i. A \$4000 mystery length cash prize for each target species will be awarded for the senior competition only.
  - ii. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, third and junior first, second and third for the target species. These prizes are for the fish measuring the longest, second longest and third longest in each category.

### **ADJUDICATION OF ENTRIES**

- 62. The winning fish for each target species will be judged by overall length. That is from the front of the mouth to the tip of the tail.

- a. First place for each target species in the senior section will be awarded to the longest fish overall; second place to the second longest fish; and third place to the third longest fish.
  - b. Junior prizes will be first place to the longest fish overall for each target species; and second place to the second longest fish for each target species; and third place to the third longest fish.
  - c. In the event of a tie (i.e. two or more fish of the same length) a countback will apply. The first fish photograph uploaded to the Pirtek Fishing Challenge website will be awarded the prize. (For example, a photo uploaded at 4.55pm will win over a fish sent at 4.56pm and measuring the identical length.)
63. All competitors, both senior and junior, may only win a maximum of one prize in the catch and release section of the competition.
- a. In the event a competitor is judged to have placed first, second, third or first in the mystery length; in two or more catch and release categories, they will only be eligible to win one category. The highest value prize will be awarded to the competitor.
    - i. For example, if a competitor placed second in Top End barramundi but first in Top End trevally; then the Top End trevally prize would be awarded.
  - b. In the event a competitor is judged to have won two x first places, or two x second places, or two x third places, or two x mystery length a countback will apply.
    - i. For example, a competitor is judged to have won third place in VIC bream (photo upload 3.40pm) and third place in VIC flathead (photo upload 3.41pm) then the bream photograph will be awarded third place.
  - c. The On The Water prize draw is a game of chance and separate to the catch and release section of the Competition. A competitor may win a prize in the On The Water prize draw and the catch and release competition.
64. Mystery length:
- a. \$4000 cash will be awarded to twenty two (22) target species that are closest to the mystery length for the senior competition only in ACT/New South Wales, Queensland, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia/South Western Australia, Murray Darling Basin, Mountain Trout, East Coast and Top End categories. Please see Clause 59 (a) for individual State/Territory and category allotment of prizes.
  - b. The mystery lengths and target species will be forwarded to a Justice of the Peace by the Committee on Thursday 15 April 2021.
  - c. The mystery lengths will not be disclosed until the winners are announced on Saturday, 1 May 2021.
  - d. In the event of a tie (i.e. two or more fish of the same mystery length or of the same metric distance away from the mystery length) a count-back will apply. The first fish photograph uploaded to the Pirtek Fishing Challenge website will be awarded the prize. (For example, a photo uploaded at 4.55pm will win over a fish sent at 4.56pm and measuring the identical length.)

- e. All mystery length winners will be ineligible to win either first, second or third prize for any target species category.
- f. All mystery lengths will be longer than the minimum legal length as per State or Territory Fisheries regulations.
- g. Example of mystery length calculation: Target fish is flathead and mystery length is 46.4mm. Two photos are submitted of flathead, one at 46.2mm and one at 46.7mm. If these two fish were the closest to the mystery length the winner would be 46.2mm.
- h. The judging committee will be supplied with the complete list of mystery lengths at the close of photo uploads 0700, Monday 19 March 2021 State and Territory time.

65. The Organiser's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

### **COMPETITION PRIZE POOL**

66. The national prize pool is as follows:

- a. For ACT/New South Wales, Queensland, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia/South Western Australia, Murray Darling Basin, Mountain Trout, East Coast and Top End categories:
  - i. Mystery Length: Twenty-two (22) x \$4000.00 cash
  - ii. First prize: Twenty-two (22) x \$1706.00 prize packs. Breakdown: ABU Garcia/Berkley products RRP \$400.00; JBL marine digital media receiver and club marine speakers. RRP \$700.00; Mako Eyewear products RRP \$299.00; and Valvoline products RRP \$307.00.
  - iii. Second prize: Twenty-two (22) x \$906.00 prize packs. Breakdown: ABU Garcia/Berkley products RRP \$300.00, Mako Eyewear products RRP \$299.00 and Valvoline products RRP \$307.00
  - iv. Third prize: Twenty-two (22) x \$549.00 prize packs. Lowrance products RRP \$549.00

  - ii. Queensland: Four (4) x \$4000 Mystery cash prize; four (4) x \$1706 1<sup>st</sup> prize; four (4) x \$906 2<sup>nd</sup> prize; four (4) x \$549 3<sup>rd</sup> prize; four (4) x
